Aiding our clients, services range from emergency food, clothing, utilities and rental assistance, referrals to government programs, veterans' services, and more importantly— a caring and supportive voice in case management to help families navigate from need to stability.

The Metro BrigAide Mobile Outreach team will serve out of the center and meet our homeless singles where they are, with services to alleviate immediate suffering and offer hope.

She came to Metro Ministries often for food, hygiene items, clothes, and backpacks and school supplies for her children each school year.
