With only 24 family units on campus, the current waitlist for residency is long. Decreasing housing inventory and skyrocketing rental prices drive desperation in families each day.

"28% of low-income Pasco renters (16,316 households) are cost burdened, meaning they spend over 40% of their income on gross rent"

22,857 nights of shelter.

68 families benefited from residential housing and programs.

88% of families have not returned to homelessness.

The expansion of new residential housing to 48 units, including 24 affordable housing studios, will provide a pipeline for families that are transitioning from homelessness in emergency shelter to transitional housing and then affordable housing.
